Our Annual Education Report 2008-09

Our caring and personable teachers provide every child with the nurturing attention needed to achieve. Eagle Academy is a tuition-free public community charter school that is proudly managed by The Leona Group and sponsored by the Ohio Council of Community Schools.

2008-09 highlights

- The academy continued to meet the educational needs of its students, demonstrating proficiency gains on the Ohio Achievement Test that resulted in AYP and Continuous Improvement designations.
- Technology continued to blossom, as the school expanded its computer lab and added a Mimio device. The building was rewired to allow for further expansion to include all new computers in the lab, additional computers in classrooms, and Smartboards in each classroom for the 2009-10 school year.
- Good grades and good behavior were rewarded. More than 100 students attended the Splash Universe positive behavior incentive trip. Students were recognized at quarterly celebrations for academic achievement, positive behavior, academic growth and making the Honor Roll.
- The academy participated in its first Spelling Bee in March and the Jr. High Science Fair in May 2009.

School progress

The school is evaluated by its sponsor on progress toward achieving state and federal academic achievement goals as measured by the Ohio Achievement and Graduation tests as well as Scantron Performance Series evaluative tools.

The academy also complies with Ohio Revised Code regarding expected gains and progress for students enrolled at the academy.

Value added: Above Expected Growth

Reading: The academy was above expected growth at grades 4 and 6; met expected growth at grade 5 and below expected growth at grade 7.

Math: The school demonstrated above-expected growth in grades 4, 5 and 7; met expected growth in grade 6.

Overall rating: Above expected growth, indicating more than one year of progress was achieved.

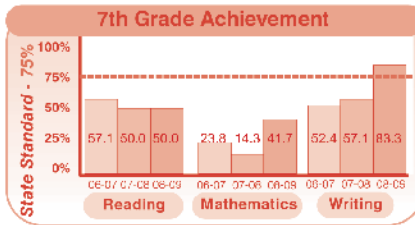
